# School Update - Teacher Presentation [Seann M, Noah Y, Krystle W, Jeannette T] – Grade 5/6 Community and Grade 4/5/6 Learning and Literacy

- Noah Y Discussed Seed to Tree, a book that illustrates the lifecycle of an idea from inception (seed) to development and maturity (tree). Students are working on a project aligned with this theme.
- Seann M Continued the classroom discussion on perseverance and growth. Students are writing their own Seed to Tree stories.
- Krystle W Provided an update on the Grade 6 Patrol Club, including shift schedules and monthly recognition. Everyone appreciated the return of pleasant weather.
- Jeannette T Shared that those students enjoyed their pizza party, which recognized their dedication as patrollers. Patrollers will receive shirts to wear on their recognition field trip. Expressed gratitude to CJPPA for their contribution.

#### **Labour Action Update**

- Labour action by the Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE) within the CBE took effect on February 24.
- For questions, reach out to the Principal, but the recommended source for updates is CBE Labour Relations. CBE Labor Relations
- Picketing has begun, including at a nearby location. Some confusion remains regarding the approach.
- Comment [Samantha M] A parent described congestion near Churchill due to the picketing.
- The primary impact on CJP is the absence of Facility Operator Mr. Pratt; teachers and education supervisors are not affected.
- Cleaning priorities are focused on high-touch areas.
- CBE's priority is to keep schools open and maintain regular instructional hours. Staff must vacate the building 45 minutes after the last bell to allow cleaning staff to begin work.

#### No impact on:

- Out-of-School Care (OSC); Field trips
- Some impact on: Meetings scheduled after 5 PM

#### School Presentation '2025 School Planning'

- Principal presented the School Development Plan, providing an overview of school planning and fees.
- A survey will open on February 26 for two weeks to gather feedback.
- A second survey will be shared with School Council meeting participants to collect input on this
  presentation.
- Survey links will be sent via the Weekly Message.
- Share information about school planning at CJP.
- Gather feedback to support future planning and address learning gaps.

A short video, "CBE School Planning and You", was shown, emphasizing:

- Supporting and improving student learning.
- Responding to school achievements and previous feedback.
- Gathering family input on school fees.

#### **Budget**

- By law, each school must submit a balanced budget.
- Discussion on parent fees when funding is insufficient to cover costs.

### **School Budget and Enrollment**

- 2024-2025 Enrollment: 608 students
- Budget Allocation: \$3.8M, with 75% allocated to staffing.
- CJP allocates 98% to staffing, a higher proportion than the CBE's recommendation of 75%.
- Elementary schools prioritize staffing, middle/high schools allocate more \$ necessary for resources.
- Budget adjustments allowed some employees to move to full-time positions.
- The Principal's philosophy: "Believe in people, not stuff."

#### School Fees

- 2024-25 Fees: Information available online.
- 2023-24 Report: Included a discussion on last year's fees and a \$500 shortfall for Mobile Escape (difference between projected and collected fees).
