How is Our School Development Plan Used?

- Guides ongoing assessment and review of goals and actions.
- Our school development plan is the driver for closing learning gaps and informs:
 - Instructional strategies
 - Professional learning
 - School structures and processes for learning
 - Resources to improve student learning
 - Data-informed decision making





School Development Plan – School Goal

 Students' foundational skills in literacy and mathematics will improve.





School Development Plan – Outcome

- Students will improve in phonological awareness and decoding skills.
- Students' procedural fluency will improve through a focus on number sense.







School Development Plan – Outcome Measures

- CC3, LeNS, AFRS and CORE phonics
- Report Card Data- Reading and Number
- Grade 6- Provincial Achievement Test (PAT)

School Development Plan – Data for Monitoring Progress

- EAL Benchmarks Analytics for LP 1 and LP 2 students in reading
- Teacher perception data- Teacher confidence in implementing UFLI and MathUP programs
- Biweekly University of Florida Literacy Institute (UFLI) student check-ins
- Intervention flexible groupings-tracking sheet
- Pre and post assessment for Grade 4-6
- Reading Decision Tree and CBE draft assessment of Number and Algebra





School Development Plan – Actions

- Learning Excellence Actions
 - Implementing Number Talks and Guided Reading
 - Implement Minds on Activities and Performance Tasks from MathUP program
 - Explicit Instruction using UFLI program to improve phonological awareness and decoding text
 - Explicit use of visuals in both Literacy and Math to support all students accessing/understanding content
 - Intentional, varied task design that increases engagement in literacy and math





School Development Plan – Actions

- Well-Being Actions
 - Create a culture that values the thinking process and strategies over speed and algorithms
 - Collaborative team continuum of supports
 - Utilize flexible groupings for specific learning needs
 - Teach self-regulation techniques through modelled co-regulation
 - Hold weekly Belonging meetings in each classroom





School Development Plan – Actions

- Truth & Reconciliation, Diversity and Inclusion Actions
 - Use of EAL benchmarking and assessment for LP1 and LP2 learners to inform task design
 - Intentional use of culturally diverse texts to build understanding, awareness and student belonging
 - Decolonize assessment to improve equity and accuracy
 - Declonize curriculum resources by replacing stories that favour
 Western worldviews with Indigenous worldviews
 - Intentional task design that provides successful entry points for all learners.





School Development Plan – Literacy Improvement

- Providing scaffolded tasks aligned with new curriculum outcomes that are accessible to all students
- Using/posting clear learning intentions and assessment criteria to support student understanding of what success looks like
- Teacher/Admin tracking of students "at risk" in literacy in October, January, and March
- Daily phonemic awareness and phonics practices, including visual, auditory, and blending drills to reinforce grapheme/phoneme correspondence using UFLI as achor resource





School Development Plan – Mathematics Improvement

- Consistent use of clear learning intentions aligned with new curriculum outcomes
- Common assessments developed by grade teams with clear assessment criteria
- Teacher/Admin tracking of students "at risk" in mathematics in October, January, and March
- Common structure to math teaching using MathUp as key resource

Our School Budget

- Our school received \$3,817,291 in 2024-25 to provide a quality education to our students and meet the goals in our school development plan (SDP).
- At least 75 per cent of budgeted funds covers staffing and the remaining portion covers instructional and operational supplies.

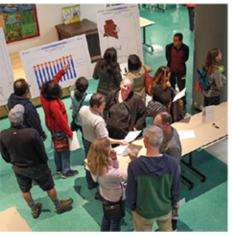




