Discussion on Parents Association Council – [Martina D]

- Communicated to meeting participants that those parents who completed the membership form are entitled to vote.
- Anyone wishing to become a member can fill out the <u>online form.</u>
- CJP PA provided an information paper for students to bring home at the beginning of the school year. It includes a QR code to sign up for a membership and links to the CJP PA website.
- It is recommended to fill out the online form to keep membership current. QR code posted in chat. Members are eligible to vote in meetings. Voting is anonymous for role elections and budgetary items.

Approval of Meeting Minutes from February 25, 2024 [Martina D]

- Amendments: Adjust the wording from Stettler to Settler in the Mural Update.

Elections

- **Decision** Alison B was appointed Treasurer by acclimation.
- Alison B acknowledges the appointment as Treasurer.
- The rest of the elections are planned on May 27, 2025
- Described the Elected Nominations and Appointed Positions that are currently open for the 2025/26 year.

Financial Review - [Martina D for Leanne G]

General Account

- Balance was \$9,600 in cash + \$33,000 in term deposits.
- Term Deposits are held for playground contingency, mural project, and student learning investment.

Gaming Account

- Balance was \$86,000 in available funds (includes new casino deposit) + \$17,600 in term deposits.
- Field Trip allocations are underway.

Description and Speaker

- Term Deposits are allocated for field trips, learning opportunities, and residencies per AGLC guidelines.
- Chair proposed to split the new Casino funds across two years to align with past allocations in the budget. Voting was conducted anonymously through an online form.
- Motion: To allocate Casino funds across the 2025/26 school year and 2026/27 school year.
- Motion Passed: 90% voted yes, 10% no. 10 responses. Chair did not vote.
- Question (Britni Y): When is the next Casino night? Response (Martina D): Likely to find out the date in September 2025. At the moment we are slotted for a date in Q2 2026.

Proposed Residency: Trickster Theatre Calgary for 2025/26 – [Jana El]

- Administration is exploring residency options for the 2025/26 school year and is preparing to apply for a grant, with a deadline of May 1.
- This year's residency proposal is with Trickster Theatre Calgary, a company that supports students in creating original performances. A few years ago, Ryan S and Jana El partnered with this group.
- The residency program includes eight professional artists, each assigned to work with a group of classes. Every group will develop a performance around a shared theme.
- Theme for 2025/26: "How to live in harmony with the Earth."
- Each class will receive a unique prop, which is kept secret until assigned. Past examples include pool noodles and shadow puppets.
- The residency will last one week for the whole school. From Monday to Thursday, students
 work with artists for approximately one-third of the day. Teachers extend this learning
 throughout the day, linking it to curricular goals.
- Thursday evening performances are scheduled between 5:30 PM and 8:00 PM, with technical rehearsals beforehand. The following Friday will be used for performance to the rest of the school body and teardown.
- A volunteer call will go out to help support the residency week and event.
- Program cost is \$16,400 + GST. If CJP receives the AFA or Federal grant (anticipated decision in Fall 2026), the cost drops to \$8,200 + GST. If not selected, Trickster Theatre offers a 25% subsidy, bringing the cost down to \$12,300 + GST.
- The maximum funding request is \$12,300 + GST, to be funded through Casino funds.
- Chair proposed the motion.
- **Motion Proposed:** To allocate \$12,300 + GST from Casino funds for the 2025/26 Trickster Theatre Calgary residency.
- Motion Passed: 100% approved. Funds will be allocated in the 2025/26 budget. A payment schedule will be arranged. Chair did not vote.
- Question [Amy G] How does this residency align with the Fine Arts curriculum? Response [Jana El] While the school's Fine Arts focus is typically on music, the residency offers a

dedicated week to explore performance arts. Skills learned will carry over into other areas, including dance and math integration.

- Question [Corrine M] Is this similar to the previous "escape room" experience?? Response [Jana El] Yes, and students are the main drivers of the experience.
- Question [Martina D] Will students be building the sets? Response [Jana El] Students work with the provided props, which often double as set elements. Examples included pool noodles and black lights. Costumes are also incorporated.
- Comment [Candace B] Expressed excitement about the creative approach. "Sounds fun!"
- Question [Martina D] When will we know the grant results? Response [Jana El] We anticipate hearing back in Fall 2026.
- Question [Martina D] When is the residency scheduled? Response [Jana El] January 2026.
- Comment [Courtney A] What other major funding needs are expected in 2025/26? Response [Martina D] Potential expenses include the residency, field trip buses, iXL licensing, insurance, and possibly mural funding—pending a response from AGLC. There may also be carryover funds from this year.

Book Fair

- There was an online donation option to help purchase books for the library. CJP PA will work with the school to use those funds to purchase books.
- Book Fair raised approx. \$5,000.

Read-a-thon

- Raised approx. \$1,400 and \$400 in prizes was donated.
- A fundraising survey will be issued in May/June for feedback.
